Director's Comments

Stories aren't told in words alone. Data and numbers are how we frame facts and explain thresholds, opinion, or comparisons. My grad school statistics class was foreign territory — working with numbers has always been a grind for me, and the skills did not seem relevant to my goals. However, when it came time to apply those skills to my Capstone research project, I found true delight discovering the correlations, trends, and differences that were explained by the data collected. Completed in 2016 with my classmate Emily Stamas, the report "Bring on the Boomers" examined the interest levels of participating in senior centers throughout Greene County.

Starting in October, YSSC asked the community to provide feedback and insight by offering a survey in the *Yellow Springs News*. As of the end of November there have been 109 respondents. There were some indications of what the community is most interested in, but perhaps missing the male perspective, since 80% of the surveys were completed by females. Here are some insights we have learned so far:

- Lectures, academic instruction, and exercise classes generated the most interest.
- YS is mostly DISinterested in Bingo, as well as Billiards or Ping Pong
- 20% (20 people) of respondents would consider moving to senior apartments either immediately or in the next 5 years
- 52% attend events at the Library, 42% participate in online activities through YSSC or other groups
- Over half of respondents report they are able to walk to the Center, 25% can bike

- 41% of respondents live alone
- The "Yellow Springs Senior Center" as a name is satisfactory for most people

The numbers are providing some evidence, generalizations, and trends. The data will only be better as we get additional responses. If you haven't yet participated, you are welcome to pick up a paper copy of the survey at the Center, or complete it on our website.

Please see page 10 to learn more details of the survey results. I will continue to develop more facts as I examine correlations (such as, is there a difference between age groups for preferred activities, schedule, challenges to participating) and how to plan for the future. Planning for the next chapters in our shared story relies on factual knowledge. Thank you for making your experience part of the collective.

MySeniorCenter, a New Computer Check-In System

We have a new, automated check-in system called MySeniorCenter which has been installed in the lobby at the Senior Center. The new system is extremely easy to use:

- All members and volunteers will receive a small keytag. (The card contains no personal info, but allows the new system to recognize you.)
- Instead of signing into the book, you'll scan your keytag at the scanner, or enter your name on the touchscreen.
- Press the touchscreen to select the programs you'll be participating in that day.
- Press FINISH.

Even though MySeniorCenter is designed to be user-friendly, the front desk volunteer will be available to help people operate the new check-in system. There will also be instructions on our website, and also sent out through our email alerts.

You'll even be able to check out the Senior Center's Calendar and register for events.

A Strong Community

If the world had a front porch like we did back then We'd still have our problems but we'd all be friends -Tracy Lawrence, If the World Had a Front Porch

An editorial in the New York Times caught my attention: As Gen X and Boomers age, they confront living alone. More older Americans are living by themselves than ever before. Perhaps this concern has been on your mind, as well. Our village has a median age over 53 years, according to the census report, and 45% of our town is over the age of 64.

Social isolation is an important concern of our times. How do we measure the harm in experiencing social isolation? Many people experience depression, anxiety, lethargy, insomnia, memory loss, and suffer from poor self-care.

I don't believe the phenomenon of social isolation is only a consequence of recent health protocols. Although Covid added a new facet to the trend, there have been many other factors exacerbating our tendency to withdraw from each other, to retreat from community. How serious a problem is social isolation in Yellow Springs? Such a phenomenon, by definition, is difficult to uncover. Yet a measure of awareness as to its occurrence might serve us well.

I grew up with front porches up and down the street. The public-facing porticos were invitational, by design, to welcome the casual passerby into our space. Here, people casually met and, through casual conversations, learned more about their neighbors. Yellow Springs still offers this ambiance in many of our neighborhoods, downtown, and in opportunities over a cup of coffee at one of our eateries.

Go to the back page for more about added patio space at the Center. In his book, The Great Good Place, Ray Oldenburg investigates the want in community of a "third place" - a place outside of work and home where human connections revive and thrive. I hope our new patio becomes such a place, a community "porch," where we feel happy, comfortable, and connected.

There are additional steps to take to stave off social isolation. Get involved in being a good neighbor. Take time to understand and know your neighbors. You might find time to volunteer to help lift up the good works in our community. Many opportunities await.

Mary's earliest formal training was in an art class at the Worcester Art Museum (MA) at the age of 5. 




Initial Survey Results

57% report there are no difficulties preventing their participation in activities. The most common reasons reported that make participation difficult were:

- 13% feel they are too young
- 13% have family obligations
- 11% reported difficulty finding parking
- 9% programs not offered at a time they are available
- 9% reported transportation challenges


